### Little Chute Canal Bridge Public Information Meeting scheduled

*Public invited to attend and provide comments on proposed Bridge Replacement*

The Village of Little Chute is conducting a public information meeting to discuss the removal and replacement of the Little Chute Canal Bridge. The meeting is scheduled to take place on Thursday, April 4, 2013, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Gerard H. Van Hoof Memorial Civic Center (Rooms N1 and N2), 625 Grand Ave., Little Chute, WI, 54140 on. The meeting will follow an informal open house format. No formal presentations will be given. Village staff and Engineering Consultant representatives will be available to discuss the proposed project and address any questions or concerns.

The proposed bridge replacement project is located along Mill Street in the Village of Little Chute. The proposed project consists of the replacement of the existing single leaf bascule vehicular bridge over the Fox River canal that provides access to Island Park, a sanitary sewer metering station and the Little Chute Dam owned and operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers. The project will replace the existing bridge with a new Dutch-style bascule pedestrian bridge providing access to the island while also accommodating canal navigation. Only pedestrian and bicycle access will be provided to Island Park via the new structure. Service vehicle access across the bridge will be allowed however general public vehicular access will not be permitted on the new bridge.

The public is encouraged to attend the meeting, provide input and ask questions concerning this project. Persons with an interest in or knowledge about historical and archaeological resources in the project area are invited to include such information as part of any comments submitted. Exhibits showing the proposed bridge replacement will be available to discuss the project on an individual basis.
