REGARDING THE POLLING SITES FOR ALL ELECTIONS HELD IN THE

WHEREAS, the Village of Little Chute, Outagamie County, Wisconsin has been required by Wisconsin Statutes, Section 5.18(3) establishing polling places; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statutes provides that no later than 30 days before an election the governing body of any municipality may, by resolution, establish a polling site replacing an old site; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statutes states that polling places shall be established for each primary and general election at least 60 days before the election, and for each other election at least 30 days before the election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village Board of the Village of Little Chute, that the voting sites be established as follows: Wards 1 through 14 will be held at the Little Chute Village Hall located at 108 West Main Street in the Community Room.

This resolution shall remain in effect until modified or rescinded, or until a new division is made following the next census.

**RESOLUTION NO. 2 , SERIES OF 2017**

**A RESOLUTION GRANTING OF A STORM SEWER EASEMENT UPON LOT #34 OF VILLAGE NORTH SUBDIVISION.**

**WHEREAS**, the Little Chute Engineering Department has recommended that the public interest is best served by retaining an easement for storm water drainage as described below; and

**WHEREAS**, the Little Chute Board of Trustees has reviewed the attached easement finding it to serve the public interest.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Little Chute Board of Trustees as follows:

1. That in consideration of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration paid to the Village of Little Chute, hereafter referred to as "Grantor" by the Village of Little Chute, hereafter acknowledged, said "Grantee", the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, said grantor does hereby grant, bargain, sell, transfer, and convey unto the Grantee, its successors and assigns a perpetual easement with the right of use, operate, inspect, repair, maintain, replace or remove storm sewer, over, across and through the lands of the Grantors situated in the Village of Little Chute, Outagamie County, State of Wisconsin, said lands being issued as follows:

PART OF LOT 34, VILLAGE NORTH SUBDIVISION, VILLAGE OF LITTLE CHUTE, OUTAGAMIE COUNTY, WISCONSIN  
SEE LEGAL DESCRIPTION EXHIBIT "A" ATTACHED HERETO, ALL OF ITS TERMS AND CONDITIONS INCORPORATED HEREIN BY REFERENCE

2. Together, with the right of ingress and egress over the adjacent lands of the Grantor, his successors and assigns, for the purposes of this easement. The easement shall be described on Exhibit "A" attached, being a map of the easement area.
3. The consideration hereinabove recited shall constitute payment in full for any damages present or future to the lands of the Grantor, his successors and assigns, by reason of the installation, operation, and maintenance of the structures or improvements referred to herein as storm sewer (and/or surface drainage). The Grantee covenants to maintain the easement in good repair so that no unreasonable damage will result from its use to adjacent lands of the Grantor, his successors and assigns.

4. The grant and others provisions of this easement easements shall constitute a covenant running with the land for the benefit of the Grantee, its successors and assigns. For the sole and exclusive use of storm sewer and/or surface drainage. Any other use shall be authorized in writing by the Grantor.
5. That the Village Clerk, and/or Village Administrator, and/or Village President are hereby authorized to execute and record easement documents on behalf of the Village of Little Chute.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 3, SERIES 2017**

#### **AN INITIAL RESOLUTION REGARDING INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT BONDS FOR DARBOY DEVELOPMENT, LLC/HEARTLAND TECHNOLOGY GROUP, INC.**

WHEREAS, the Village of Little Chute, Wisconsin, (the "Village") is authorized by Section 66.1103, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended (the "Act"), to acquire, construct, equip, reconstruct, improve, maintain, repair, enlarge or remodel industrial projects, and to enter into revenue producing agreements for same, in order to promote the right to gainful employment, business opportunities and general welfare of its inhabitants and to preserve and finance costs related to such industrial projects through the issuance of industrial development revenue bonds, which bonds are to be payable solely out of the revenues derived pursuant to the revenue agreement pertaining to the project to be financed by the bonds so issued and which bonds may be secured by a mortgage or other security interest on the project; and

WHEREAS, the Village is authorized to refund bonds previously issued under the Act with refunding bonds also issued under the Act; and

WHEREAS, Darboy Development, LLC, a Wisconsin limited liability company, (the "Eligible Participant") desires to expand, acquire, construct, improve and/or equip its manufacturing facility located in the Village which is leased to Heartland Technology Group, Inc., a Wisconsin corporation (such expansion, acquisition, construction, improvement and/or equipping is hereinafter referred to as the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Eligible Participant desires to refund the outstanding balance on the \$1,200,000 Village of Little Chute, Outagamie County, Wisconsin Industrial Development Revenue Bonds (Heartland Label Printers, Inc. Project) Series 2010 Bonds (hereinafter referred to as the "Refunding"); and

WHEREAS, the Project and the Refunding is estimated to require the issuance of bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Eligible Participant has represented that the Project qualifies to be financed with industrial development revenue bonds under Wis. Stat. 66.1103(2)(k)1. as a manufacturing facility; and

WHEREAS, the Eligible Participant desires and has requested assistance from the Village in financing the cost of the Project and the Refunding through the issuance by the Village of its industrial development revenue bonds pursuant to the Act;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF LITTLE CHUTE, WISCONSIN, THAT:

(1) In view of the considerable benefits to be derived by the Village from the development of the Project and the Refunding, the Village intends to work toward the consummation of a project financing agreement pursuant to which the Village shall:

(a) issue, sell and deliver to purchasers (to be obtained by the Eligible Participant) its industrial development revenue bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$4,000,000 (the "Bonds") in order to finance costs related to the Project and to accomplish the Refunding, which Bonds shall be payable solely out of the revenues derived from a note and mortgage or other security agreement on the Project or from such other revenue agreement as may be permitted by law; and

(b) lend the proceeds of the Bonds to the Eligible Participant who will use the proceeds to help finance the Project and accomplish the Refunding (and for any other purposes permitted by the Act) and enter into a note and mortgage agreement or other security agreement with the Eligible Participant or enter into other lawful revenue-producing agreements with respect to the Project and the Refunding providing revenues sufficient to pay principal of and interest on the Bonds when due; and

(c) assign the note and mortgage agreement or other security agreement or other revenue agreement and pledge the revenues and other amounts therefrom to the bondholders, or to a servicer, or a trustee under an indenture of trust, in order to secure the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds.

(2) THE BONDS SHALL NEVER CONSTITUTE AN INDEBTEDNESS OF THE VILLAGE WITHIN THE MEANING OF ANY STATE CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISION OR STATUTORY LIMITATION, AND SHALL NOT CONSTITUTE OR GIVE RISE TO A PECUNIARY LIABILITY OF THE VILLAGE OR A CHARGE AGAINST ITS GENERAL CREDIT OR TAXING POWERS.

(3) All expenses incurred in connection with the transactions herein contemplated shall be paid by the Eligible Participant from the proceeds of the Bonds, or otherwise, and shall not be the responsibility of the Village.

(4) Taxes shall be assessed in accordance with applicable law to the Eligible Participant with respect to the Project in the same manner and amount as though the Project was not being financed by an industrial development revenue bond.

(5) The appropriate officers of the Village are hereby authorized to negotiate the terms of a project financing agreement, note and mortgage or other security agreement or other revenue agreement, instruments of conveyance, mortgage and indenture of trust, if any, and any other documents required to properly complete the financing, provided that all such terms and procedures followed shall be subject to the conditions of this resolution and the provisions of Section 66.1103, Wisconsin Statutes, as amended, and shall not be binding unless and until:

(a) the details of the project financing agreement and all documents pertinent thereto are reviewed, authorized and approved by a definitive resolution of this Village Board.

(b) the electors of the Village have been given the opportunity to petition within 30 days from the date of publication of notice of adoption of this initial resolution for a referendum on the question of the issuance of the Bonds as provided by law;

(c) either no such valid petition for referendum shall have been timely filed or if such petition has been filed the said bond issue shall have been approved by a referendum; and

(d) all documents required in connection with the financing shall have been duly executed by the parties thereto and delivered to the extent required; and

(e) all applicable provisions of Federal law including Section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, have been complied with.

(6) Notice of the adoption of this resolution of intent shall be published as a Class 1 notice in the official newspaper of the Village, the Times-Villager in the form attached hereto.

(7) The Village Clerk, or the law firm of Nelson & Schmeling, shall file a copy of (a) this resolution, and (b) the notice referred to in paragraph (6) above with the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation within twenty (20) days following the publication of such notice.

(8) This resolution shall be effective for two (2) years after the date it is initially adopted.

**RESOLUTION REGARDING  
PUBLIC BIDDING AND NON-DISCRIMINATION IN CONNECTION WITH  
INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BOND FINANCING**

WHEREAS, the Village Board for the Village of Little Chute, Wisconsin (the "Village") has or will approve an initial resolution for the issuance of industrial development revenue bonds by the Village on behalf of Darboy Development, LLC, a Wisconsin limited liability company (the "Eligible Participant"); and

WHEREAS, the project (the "Project") to be financed with the proceeds of the bonds will be located in the Village and will consist of the expansion, acquisition, construction, improvement and/or equipping of a manufacturing facility to be owned by the Eligible Participant and leased to Heartland Technology Group, Inc. a Wisconsin corporation; and

WHEREAS, the Village finds it beneficial toward the completion of the Project to waive the requirements of Wis. Stat. 66.1103(11)(b) in connection with the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THIS VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF LITTLE CHUTE, WISCONSIN, THAT:

1. The requirements as specified in Wis. Stat. 66.1103(11)(b)1. are to be waived in accordance with the provisions of Wis. Stat. 66.1103(11)(b)2. with reference to the Project to be financed with the industrial development revenue bonds of the Village issued on behalf of the Eligible Participant for the Project because the Village is not responsible for controlling any of the expansion, acquisition, construction, improvement and/or equipping costs and because it is more efficient and expedient for the accomplishment of the public purposes of the Project if the Eligible Participant were to have complete control over the Project.

2. The Bonds, when issued, will contain such provisions regarding non-discrimination as the Village shall require.



3. This resolution shall be published as a Class 1 notice in the official newspaper of the Village, the Times-Villager, prior to the closing of the bond issue.

#### **A RESOLUTION DESIGNATING PUBLIC DEPOSITORIES AND CUSTODIAN**

WHEREAS, Chapter 34.05(1), Wis. Stats., authorizes designation of public depositories; and

WHEREAS, the governing body shall designate one or more public depositories organized and doing business under the laws of this state or federal law and located in this state, in which the Finance Director/Treasurer shall deposit all public monies received by him or her; and

WHEREAS, public funds shall be maintained in deposits and other instruments subject to the limitations of Section 66.0603(1m), Wis. Stats. with further criteria as specified in the Village of Little Chute Investment Policy; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village Board of Trustees that the following institutions are hereby designated as public depositories:

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Financial Institutions named above and designated as a depository for the funds of the Village of Little Chute, WI at any one or more of their offices or branches, may have funds withdrawn on checks, drafts, advices of debit, notes or other orders for the payment of monies bearing the appropriate signatures.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Financial Institution is hereby directed to accept and pay without further inquiry any item drawn against any of the Entity's accounts with the Financial Institution bearing the signature or signatures of Agents, as authorized or otherwise, even though drawn or endorsed to the order of any Agent signing or tendered by such Agent for cashing or in payment of the individual obligation of such Agent or for deposit to the Agent's personal account, and the Financial Institution shall not be required or be under any obligation to inquire as to the circumstances of the issue or use of any item signed in accordance with the resolutions contained herein, or the application or disposition of such item or the proceeds of the item.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that any one of such agents is authorized to endorse all checks, drafts, notes and other items payable to or owned by this Entity for deposit with the Financial Institution, or for collection or discount by the Financial Institution; and to accept drafts and other items payable at the Financial Institution.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the above named agents are authorized and empowered to execute such other agreements, including, but not limited, to special depository agreements and arrangements regarding the manner, conditions, or purposes for which funds, checks, or items of the Village of Little Chute may be deposited, collected, or withdrawn and to perform such other acts as they deem reasonably necessary to carry out the provisions of these resolutions. The other agreements and other acts may not be contrary to the provisions contained in this Resolution.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the authority hereby conferred upon the above named Agents shall be and remain in full force and effect until written notice of any amendment or revocation thereof shall have been delivered to and received by the Financial Institution at each location where an account is maintained. Financial Institution shall be indemnified and held harmless from any loss suffered or any liability incurred by it in continuing to act in accordance with this resolution. Any such notice shall not affect any items in process at the time notice is given.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the above list of institutions will be incorporated into the Village Investment Policy as Exhibit A – Public Depositories and updated on at least an annual basis.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that James Fenlon, Village Administrator, Teresa Matheny, Finance Director, Marlene Derricks and Kelly Vanden Heuvel are designated as account contacts and authorized to process transactions for the Village of Little Chute.

BE IT FURTHER CERTIFIED that the foregoing Resolution now stands of record; that it is in full force and effect and has not been modified in any manner whatsoever.

## **Village of Little Chute, WI Investment Policy**

### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to those funds that are under the authority of the Village of Little Chute, Wisconsin (Village).

### **GENERAL OBJECTIVES**

#### **1. Safety**

Investments shall be undertaken in a manner that seeks to ensure the preservation of capital in individual investments and the overall portfolio. The objective will be to mitigate credit risk, interest rate risk and custodial risk.

##### **a. Credit Risk**

The Village will minimize credit risk, which is the risk of loss due to the failure of the security issuer or backer, by:

- Limiting investments to the types of securities permitted under Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 66.0603.
- The Village Board shall by resolution approve the public depositories that are deemed appropriate for use under Wisconsin and Federal law.
- Diversifying the investment portfolio so that the impact of potential losses from any one type of security or from any one individual issuer will be minimized.

##### **b. Interest Rate Risk**

The Village will minimize interest rate risk, which is the risk that the market value of securities in the portfolio will fall due to changes in market interest rates, by:

- Structuring the investment portfolio so that securities mature to meet cash requirements for ongoing operations, thereby avoiding the need to sell securities on the open market prior to maturity.

##### **c. Custodial Risk**

The Village will minimize custodial risk, which is the risk that in the event of a financial institution failure, the Village's deposits may not be returned to it, by:

- Maintaining a list of public depositories, financial institutions and broker/dealers authorized to provide deposit and investment services.
- All public depositories, financial institutions and broker/dealers authorized to provide deposit and investment services must supply as appropriate audited financial statements demonstrating compliance with state and federal capital adequacy guidelines.

#### **2. LIQUIDITY**

The investment portfolio shall remain sufficiently liquid to meet all operating requirements that may be reasonably anticipated. Investment portfolios will be structured so that securities mature concurrent with cash needs to meet anticipated demands. Alternatively, a portion of any portfolio may be placed in money market mutual funds or local government investment pools authorized and permissible under Wisconsin statutes which offer same-day liquidity for short term funds.

### **3. YIELD**

Investment portfolios shall be designed with the objective of attempting to attain a market rate of return throughout budgetary and economic cycles, taking into account investment risk constraints and liquidity needs. Return on investment is of secondary importance compared to the safety and liquidity objectives described above. Securities shall generally be held until maturity with the following exceptions;

- A security with declining credit quality may be sold prior to maturity to minimize loss of principal.
- Liquidity needs of the Village require a security or securities are sold prior to maturity.
- A security swap would improve the safety and yield of the overall portfolio.

With the exception of cash accounts, all investments will be selected on the basis of competitive quotations; at least two qualified institutions will be contacted each time an investment is placed.

## **I. STANDARDS OF CARE**

### **1. Prudence**

The standard of prudence to be used by investment officials shall be the “prudent person” standard, which states “investments shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the probable safety of their capital as well as the probable income to be derived” and shall be applied in the context of managing an overall portfolio.

Investment officers acting in accordance with written procedures and this Investment Policy and exercising due diligence shall be relieved of personal responsibility for an individual security’s credit risk or market price changes, provided deviations from expectations are reported in a timely manner and the liquidity and the sale of securities are carried out in accordance with the terms of this policy. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Finance Director (or other Village employee in the absence of the Finance Director) who deposits public money in any authorized public depository, in compliance with Wisconsin statutes sec. 34.05 is, under the provisions of Wisconsin statutes sec. 34.06, relieved of any liability for any loss of public monies which results from the failure of any public depository to repay the public depositor the full amount of its deposits, thus causing a loss as defined in Wisconsin Statutes sec. 34.01(2).

### **2. Ethics and Conflicts of Interest**

Village officers and employees involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with the proper execution and management of the investment program, or that could impair their ability to make impartial decisions. Officers and employees shall refrain from undertaking personal investment transactions with the same individual with whom business is conducted on behalf of the Village.

### **3. Delegation of Authority**

Management and administrative responsibility for the investment program of the Village is entrusted to the Finance Director under the directions of the Village Board. Individuals authorized to engage in investment transactions on behalf of the Village are the Finance Director, the Village Administrator or those individuals designated by the Finance Director, Village Administrator or Village Board.

#### **4. Authorized and Suitable Investments**

Authorized investments include any investment stipulated in Wisconsin statute 66.0603 (1m).

- a) In accordance with Wisconsin statutes 34.01 (5) and 34.09 all Wisconsin banks, state or federal chartered, as well as the Wisconsin local government pooled-investment fund, are authorized depositories.
- b) Financial institutions that are members of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) and deposits in such institution are insured by the FDIC are authorized depositories.

## **II. INTERNAL CONTROLS**

- The Finance Director shall establish a system of internal controls designed to prevent losses of Village funds arising from fraud, misrepresentation by third parties, unanticipated changes in financial markets, employee error or imprudent actions by employees.

Internal controls shall address:

- Separation of transaction authority from accounting and record keeping.
- Clear delegation of authority to subordinate staff members.
- Written confirmation of transactions for investments and wire transfers.
- Dual authorizations of wire transfers.
- Development of a wire transfer agreement with the lead bank and third-party custodian.
- Investment and interest earnings will be recorded in the Village's accounting records based on generally accepted government accounting procedures.
- A quarterly summary of all investment transactions will be prepared by the Finance Director for review by the Village Board.

## **IV. INVESTMENT PARAMETERS**

### **Diversification**

Investments shall be diversified by:

- Limiting investments to avoid over concentration in securities from a specific issuer, industry or business sector, excluding U.S. Treasury obligations.
- Investing in securities with varying maturities.
- Continuously investing a portion of the investment portfolio in readily available funds such as local government investment pools, money market accounts or money market mutual funds permissible under state statute.

## **V. REPORTING**

The Finance Director shall present a quarterly report on the investment program and investment activity to the Village Board. The report shall include a management summary displaying the status of the investment portfolio and transactions made over the previous month. The management summary shall be prepared in a manner that will allow the Village Board to determine if investment activities during the reporting period conform to this Investment Policy.

## **VI. POOLING OF CASH**

Except where otherwise provided by the Village Board, the Finance Director is authorized to pool the cash of various funds to maximize investment earnings where it is advantageous and prudent to do so. Investment income will be allocated to the various funds based on the pro rata portion of each fund.

## **VII. ADOPTION AND APPROVAL**

By resolution, the Investment Policy shall be formally approved and adopted by the Village Board and reviewed as needed but at least every three years.

**EXPLANATION:** In early January, the Little Chute Diamond Club approached the Village of Little Chute on an opportunity to build an indoor batting cage on Village property within Legion or Van Lieshout Park. The Little Chute Diamond Club was offered a 7211 sq ft metal building at a discounted price.

The building would be utilized by both the Little Chute Diamond Club and the Village of Little Chute Parks, Recreation, & Forestry Department. The Little Chute Diamond Club would utilize the building for indoor batting practice and meeting space. In return the Parks, Recreation, & Forestry Department would lease a portion of the building for youth archery, adult fitness classes, tennis, tot lot, martial arts, gymnastics, meeting space, and other new programs. This building also could potentially be utilized for public rental on the nights or weekends that it is not in use.

Currently, the Little Chute Diamond Club and the Village of Little Chute are investigating an option whereas the Little Chute Diamond Club would purchase the building through a loan with the Bank of Little Chute. The Village would need to sign on the loan as guarantor. The Little Chute Diamond Club would be ultimately responsible for the loan. The Village would in turn pay a yearly or monthly amount to lease a portion of the building for usage by the Village. The Village and Little Chute Diamond Club would also enter into a land lease agreement to place the building within a Village park.
