Disposal of Unused and Unwanted Pet / Human Medications

Residents may now dispose of unused and unwanted pet / human medications at the City of Appleton Police Department, located at 222 S. Walnut Street, Appleton. The drop box is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The following items *can* be dropped off: unused and expired prescription medications, over the counter medications, pet medications, and inhalers.

The reasons for properly disposing of unused and unwanted pet / human medications are: it helps the environment by keeping the drugs out of our water supplies, medications are taken to an EPA regulated incinerator that specializes in medication disposal, it helps prevent accidental poisoning, particularly in young children and pets, it helps prevent illegal diversion by teens and thieves, it helps prevent identity theft, and it is completely anonymous.

The following items *cannot* be dropped off: no Sharps (needles, syringes, etc.), no hazardous or chemical waste, no lancets, no mercury products, and no electronic glucose monitoring devices.
